Henry G. Kuivila's good grades helped Henry to be hired by Diamond Alkali in 1936. By 1948 he had graduated from Ohio State, worked for the Manhattan Project, married Nancy Corn, received a PhD in Chemistry from Harvard University and begun a career as Professor of Chemistry at the University of New Hampshire. While there his children, Henry Jr., Nancy, and Ronald were born. In 1964 he moved to the University of New York at Albany. Besides teaching and helping to develop PhD programs at both universities, he continued research on organo-tin compounds. For Henry science did not negate religion. Of his work he said, "I am one of the lucky ones. I do what I like to do and get paid for it." May all Harding graduates become "lucky ones."
